**THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF SALE PRICES OF SCHEDULED ARTICLES)
CONSOLIDATION ORDERS, 1940 TO 1942.**

NOTICE No. 127 UNDER CLAUSE 13.

A.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 40 and the substitution thereof of the following part:—

“PART 40.—MARGARINE.

In this Part of the Schedule—

the term ‘wholesale’ means the sale or purchase of margarine in quantities in excess of 1 tin.”

B.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following part:—

“PART 79.—LOCAL BROOMS.

Type of local brooms.	Retail price.	Wholesale price.
Local brooms with 3 bindings and containing not less than 150 drams of broom corn.	4 shillings and 4½ piastres each	4 shillings and 1½ piastres each.

In this Part of the Schedule—

‘wholesale’ means sale or purchase of local brooms ex factory in quantities exceeding 12 in number at any one time or at any single transaction.”
