THE CYPRUS PENSIONS ORDERS AND LAWS, 1929 TO 1941.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 3.

C. C. WOOLLEY,
Governor.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Cyprus Pensions Orders and Laws, 1929 to 1941, and with the sanction of the Secretary of State, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Cyprus Pensions (Amendment No. 2) Regulations, 1943, and shall be read as one with the Cyprus Pensions Regulations 1929 to 1943, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Cyprus Pensions Regulations, 1929 to (No. 2) 1943.

2. Paragraph (1) of Regulation 7 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) by the deletion from the proviso of the words " , with the approval of the Secretary of State," ;

(b) by the insertion therein at the end thereof of the following further proviso :
" Provided further that if such average is less than the pensionable emoluments which would have been enjoyed by him at the date of his retirement, if he had continued to hold any office from which he has been transferred at any time during such period of three years, and has received all increments which, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, would have been granted to him, the annual pensionable emoluments which would have been so enjoyed shall be taken."

No. 466. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 1) 1943.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1943, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Footwear and Shoemakers Licensing) Amendment Order, 1943, and shall be read as one with the Defence (Control of Footwear and Shoemakers Licensing) Order, 1943, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Defence (Control of Footwear and Shoemakers Licensing) Orders, 1943.

2. The principal Order is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the First and Second Schedules and the substitution therefor of the following Schedules respectively:—
