Any foreign ingredient or extraneous matter in any barley in excess of the maximum percentage of 4% permitted by the Adulteration of Produce (Local Sales) Regulations, 1940 and 1941, shall not be paid for and there may be deducted from the price of such barley, by the purchaser or the person taking delivery, any expenses required or incurred for cleaning such barley from any foreign ingredient or extraneous matter in excess of 4% as aforesaid. Condition:

Where sales of barley are made by the Government the purchaser shall surrender to the Government on each occasion a number of empty bags in good condition equivalent to the number of bags purchased by him.
