No. 99. THE WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY LAWS, 1913 TO 1934.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2075

MADE UNDER SECTION 4.

I, the Acting Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor in Council by the Wireless Telegraphy Laws, 1913 to 1934, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This order may be cited as the Wireless Telegraphy (Receiving Licence) (Amendment) Order, 1943, and shall be read as one with the Wireless Telegraphy (Receiving Licence) Order, 1934, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the principal Order and this order may together be cited as the Wireless Telegraphy (Receiving Licence) Orders, 1934 and 1943.

2. Clause 2 of the principal Order is hereby amended by the addition at the end thereof of the following proviso:—

" Provided that where under any regulations in force for the time being no fee is paid for such licence the form contained in the Schedule hereto shall be used with such variations or amendments as may be necessary to suit the case."

No. 100. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO (No. 2) 1942.

I, the Acting Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor in Council by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 2) 1942, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Kerosene) Exemption Order, 1943.

2. From and after the 1st day of April, all kerosene imported into the Colony shall be admitted free from all import duties.
