No. 114. THE COMMISSIONS OF ENQUIRY LAW, 1942.

COMMISSION OF ENQUIRY APPOINTED UNDER SECTION 2.

C. C. WOOLLEY,
Governor.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2 of the Commissions of Enquiry Law, 1942, do hereby order as follows:—

1. I hereby appoint with effect from the 24th March, 1944, a Commission of Enquiry consisting of three Commissioners, that is to say:—

The Colonial Secretary, Chairman.
The Commissioner of Labour.
The Director of Medical Services.

2. The terms of reference to the Commission shall be to enquire into questions of wages and conditions of employment in relation to the cost of living.

3. The Commission shall have all the powers set out in section 7 of the Commissions of Enquiry Law, 1942.

4. The Commission shall report to me as soon as they complete their deliberations.

No. 115. THE HOTELS LAWS, 1935 TO 1943.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 12.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 12 of the Hotels Laws, 1935 to 1943, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Hotels (Amendment No. 2) Regulations, 1944, and shall be read as one with the Hotels Regulations, 1935 and 1944, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Hotels Regulations, 1935 to (No. 2) 1944. 4.10.1935
31. 1.1944

2. Regulation 8c of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after paragraph (3) thereof of the following paragraph:—

“(4) Every hotel-keeper shall keep a special book wherein to enter daily the amount of service charges received by way of percentage on bills and such service charges shall be distributed among the servants in accordance with the approved scheme.”

3. Regulation 9A of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the insertion therein at the end thereof of the following proviso:—

“Provided that two or more servants may exchange their hours of leisure, hours of sleep and hours of duty or their day's holiday if they make a joint application therefor in writing to the hotel-keeper or the manager and such application is approved by the hotel-keeper or manager. The application if approved shall be posted up in the same place as the list aforementioned.”
