## THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO 1944.

## ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1944, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Stationary Engines) Order, 1944.

2. In this Order—

“Fuel and Charcoal Controller” means the person appointed as such under the Defence (Control of Fuel and Charcoal) Orders, 1943.

“Stationary Engine” means any internal combustion engine used for the generation of power and which is normally operating from a fixed position.

3.—(1) From and after the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette* no person shall sell, purchase, dispose of or otherwise deal with any stationary engine without a licence from the Fuel and Charcoal Controller.

(2) A licence issued under this clause may contain such terms, limitations and conditions (including the price at which the stationary engine may be sold, purchased or disposed of) as the Fuel and Charcoal Controller may think fit to impose.

4. Within fifteen days from the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette* every person who has in his possession or under his control any stationary engine shall complete and deliver to the Fuel and Charcoal Controller a return in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto in respect of the stationary engine in his possession or under his control.

5. Every person shall permit such person as the Fuel and Charcoal Controller may authorize in writing in that behalf to enter upon and inspect his premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with or for the purpose of checking the correctness or accuracy of any return made under the provisions of clause 4 of this Order.

6. Any person who—

- (a) acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order;
- (b) makes any false statement in any application for a licence under this Order;
- (c) fails to comply with any term, limitation or condition in any licence issued under this Order;
- (d) makes, under clause 4 of this Order, a return which is false in any material particular;
- (e) knowingly misleads or otherwise interferes with or impedes any person exercising any powers or performing any duties under the provisions of this Order;

is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulations 61 and 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1944.
