THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1944.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2128

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1944, do hereby order as follows:-

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Edible Oils) Exemption Order,
- 2. All edible oils imported into the Colony shall be admitted into the Colony free from all import duties.
 - 3. This Order shall be deemed to have been made on the 22nd May, 1944.

THE POST OFFICE LAWS, 1881 TO 1933.

- I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Post Office Laws, 1881 to 1933, do hereby order as follows:
- 1. This order may be cited as the Post Office (Rates of Postage and Postal Charges) (Amendment) Order, 1944 and shall be read as one with the Post Office (Rates of Postage and Postal Charges) Orders, 1940 and 1942, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the principal Order and this order may together be cited as the Post Office (Rates of Postage and Postal Charges) Orders, 1940

2. The First Schedule to the principal Order is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the entries relating to "Letters" under the heading "INLAND" and the substitution therefor of the following entries:—

" Letters : Piastres. Not exceeding 1 oz. For every additional 1 oz. or fraction thereof ...

3. This Order shall come into force on the 17th day of July, 1944.
