No. 257. NOTICE UNDER THE FORESHORE PROTECTION LAW, 1934.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 3 (1) of the Foreshore Protection Law No. 46 of 1934, I hereby absolutely prohibit :

- (a) The removal of stones, shingle, gravel, sand or other substance from all that area of foreshore described in the Schedule hereto ;

- (b) The dumping of any rubble, rubbish, sweepings, litter, night-soil or other refuse upon any part of the Foreshore described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Lapithos village.

The foreshore commences at the mouth of the river Yanitserou (Government Survey Plan XI. 5) and proceeds north-eastwards and south-eastwards to the mouth of the river Mavrolimni (Government Survey Plan XI. 16) as shewn delineated in yellow on Government Survey Plan Serial No. 1300 deposited in the Office of the Commissioner, Kyrenia. The foreshore includes all land within a distance of 50 yards from the high water mark.

ORDER MADE BY A COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as a Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1944, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Footwear and Shoemakers Licensing) Amendment Order, 1944, and shall be read as one with the Defence (Control of Footwear and Shoemakers Licensing) Orders, 1943, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Defence (Control of Footwear and Shoemakers Licensing) Orders, 1943 to 1944.

2. The principal Order is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the First and Second Schedules and the substitution therefor of the following Schedules respectively:—
