No. 264. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO 1944.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 75 (1)

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Lights) Order, 1944.

2. In this Order—

“alert” means the period between the sounding of an air raid warning and the sounding of the all clear signal;

“hours of darkness” means the interval between half an hour after sunset and half an hour before sunrise.

3. No light shall be displayed during the hours of darkness in any place in the Colony from which the sea is visible except inside a roofed building or other covered enclosure and then only in such manner that any illumination therefrom shall not face or show on to the sea:

Provided that during an alert no light of any kind shall be displayed during the hours of darkness in any place in the Colony except inside a roofed building or other covered enclosure and then only in such manner that any illumination therefrom shall not be visible from outside the building or other covered enclosure.

4. Nothing in clause 3 of this Order shall apply—

(a) to the display of any light which is authorized by or on behalf of the Commissioner of Police, so long as any conditions imposed by him or on his behalf in relation to the display are complied with; or

(b) to the display of any light by any member of the Cyprus Police Force or any member of His Majesty's Forces acting in the course of his duty as such; or

(c) to the display of any lights required to be carried by any vehicle under any law or regulation in force for the time being:

Provided that during an alert—

(i) all vehicles not authorized to move shall be brought to and remain at a standstill and the driver thereof shall cause all the lights thereof to be extinguished;

(ii) vehicles authorized to move shall have illuminated only side and tail lights and all other lights extinguished.

5. Any person who contravenes—

(a) any of the provisions of this Order;

(b) any condition imposed by the Commissioner of Police or on his behalf under clause 4 (a),

is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1944.

6. The Defence (Control of Lights) Order, 1940, and the Larnaca Town Defence (Control of Lights) Order, 1940, are hereby repealed.
