REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 8.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 8 of the Agricultural Produce (Export) Law, 1933, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Agricultural Produce (Dried Figs) Export (Amendment No. 1) Regulations, 1944, and shall be read as one with the Agricultural Produce (Dried Figs) Export Regulations, 1944, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Agricultural Produce (Dried Figs) Export Regulations, 1944 to (No. 1) 1944.

2. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of regulation 15 and the substitution therefor of the following regulation:—

"15. Nothing in these regulations shall apply to dried figs not exceeding three pounds in weight exported through the post."

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR.

Governor.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, as extended to the Colony by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1942, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Pharmacy Laws (Suspension of Certain Provisions) Regulations, 1944, and shall be read and construed as one with the Pharmacy Laws, 1900 and 1926, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law").

- (2) The Interpretation Law, 1935, shall apply to these regulations as it applies to the interpretation of a law.
- 2. During the continuance in force of these regulations section 5 of the principal Law shall be suspended and the following section shall have effect in lieu thereof:—
 "Persons licensed to deal in Supply poisons to be used in any lawful trade, craft or business. Any licence issued under this section may contain such terms and conditions as the Director of Medical Services may think fit to impose."
