No. 282. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 2) 1944.

ORDER UNDER REGULATION 55 (1) (b).

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by regulation 55 (1) (b) of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1944, do hereby make the following order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Use of Vehicles) Prohibition Order, 1944.

2.—(1) From and after the 27th August, 1944, notwithstanding anything in any other law or order contained, no person shall use or travel in any vehicle whatsoever on any highway or road outside the municipal limits of any municipal corporation without a special permit issued by the Commissioner of the District in which such person resides or by any person authorized by him in writing in that behalf, under the provisions of this Order.

(2) A permit may be issued or refused at the discretion of the Commissioner and may contain such terms, limitations and conditions as the Commissioner may think fit to impose.

3. Any person who acts in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order or of any term, limitation or condition contained in any permit issued to such person under this Order, is liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1944.

No. 283. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 2) 1944.

ORDER UNDER REGULATION 29 (2).

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by paragraph (2) of regulation 29 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1944, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Restriction of Publications) Order, 1944.

2.—(1) No person shall print, publish, circulate, distribute or post up any bill, placard, poster, notice or advertisement without first obtaining a permit in writing from the Commissioner of the District.

(2) The Commissioner may grant or withhold a permit at his discretion and may grant a permit subject to such terms and conditions as to him may seem fit to be specified therein.

3. Any person who acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, the provisions of this Order or of any term or condition specified in any permit issued by the Commissioner under paragraph (2) of clause 2 of this Order, is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1944.

4. Nothing in this Order shall apply to any bill, placard, poster, notice or advertisement—

- (a) printed, published, circulated, distributed or posted up by or on behalf of the Government of the Colony or of His Majesty's Forces;
- (b) relating to any service in any church, chapel or mosque;
- (c) relating to any theatrical or cinematograph performance;
- (d) published in any newspaper printed or published under the Newspaper, Books and Printing Presses Laws, 1934 to 1944;
- (e) posted up or exhibited by any person upon his premises relating to the business, profession or trade carried in such premises.
