SPECIAL AUTHORIZATION UNDER SECTION 13A (1).

I, the Acting Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor by section 13A (1) of the Village Authorities Laws, 1931 to (No. 2) 1937, do hereby authorize the Mukhtar whose name appears in the schedule hereto to issue, on the application in writing of a Police Officer of any rank not lower than that of Sergeant, Class II, or any Police Officer in charge of a Police Station, warrants for the purposes of the said section of the said Laws.

THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 2) 1944. No. 323.

ORDER MADE BY A COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61. In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1944, I hereby order as follows :--

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Returns of Dealings in Carobs) Order, 1944.

2. In this Order-

" carobs " means carobs of the crop of the year 1944; " whole carobs " means carobs from which the kernels have not been extracted; "kibbled carobs" means all carobs broken by a kibbling process during which the carob kernels are removed;

" carob kernels" means carob kernels extracted by kibbling from carobs.

3. On or before the 23rd October, 1944; every person who has purchased whole carobs between the 15th August, 1944, and the 30th September, 1944, shall complete and deliver to me a return containing the particulars set forth in the First Schedule hereto.

4. Not later than six days after the last day of each month commencing from the month of October, 1944, every dealer in whole carobs, kibbled carobs or carob kernels shall complete and deliver to me a return containing the particulars set forth in

the Second or Third Schedule hereto as the case may be. 5. Every person who purchases carobs shall keep a book wherein he shall enter or cause to be entered the quantity purchased, the name of the producer from whom the carobs were purchased, the town or village at which the carobs were delivered and the price per kantar paid to the producer.

6. Every person shall permit such person as I, or the Commissioner of the District, may authorize in writing in that behalf to enter upon and inspect his premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with.

- 7. Any person who— (a) acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order;
- (b) makes, under any of the provisions of this Order, a return or entry which is false in any material particular
- (c) knowingly misleads or otherwise interferes with or impedes any person exercising any powers or performing any duties under the provisions of this Order,

is liable to the penalties prescribed in the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1944.
