

No. 378. THE POST OFFICE LAWS, 1881 TO 1933.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2145

MADE UNDER SECTION 6.

I, the Acting Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor in Council by section 6 of the Post Office Laws, 1881 to 1933, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Post Office (Airgraph Rate of Postage) Order, 1944.

2. The charge for an airgraph message from Cyprus to the United Kingdom and to other countries to which the service is available, written on a specially designed form obtainable at any Post Office, shall be three piastres for each completed form.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 12th day of December, 1944, and as from that date the Post Office (Airgraph Rate of Postage) Orders, 1942 to (No. 2) 1943, shall be deemed to be revoked.

THE TRADES AND INDUSTRIES (REGULATION) LAWS, 1937 AND 1942.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2146

MADE UNDER SECTION 4 (1).

I, the Acting Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor by section 4 (1) of the Trades and Industries (Regulation) Laws, 1937 and 1942, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trades and Industries (Regulated Trades) (Amendment) Order, 1944, and shall be read as one with the Trade and Industries (Regulated Trades) Orders, 1937 and 1939, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Trades and Industries (Regulated Trades) Orders, 1937 to 1944.

2. The Schedule to the principal Order is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the following items:—

" 3. Bakeries.

5. Cafés in which more than five persons, excluding the owner or the person in charge thereof, are employed.

8. Confectionery shops.

17. Hairdressers establishments."

No. 380. THE LAND ACQUISITION LAWS, 1899 TO 1944.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 4.

Whereas it has been represented to me that it is desirable in the public interest to erect a store (with the necessary appurtenances thereto) on plots falling within Ibrahim Pasha and Yeni Jami Quarters of Nicosia:

Now, therefore, I Hugh Mackintosh Foot, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, by virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 2, 3 and 4 of the Land Acquisition Laws, 1899 to 1944, do hereby declare the erection of the store (with the necessary appurtenances thereto) aforesaid to be an undertaking of public utility and do hereby authorize the carrying out of the said undertaking and do hereby entrust the Director of Public Works the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking.
