NOTICE NO. 133 UNDER CLAUSE 13.

A.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion from Part 23 (relating to kerosene) of columns (1) and (2) and by the substitution thereof of the following:—

In this Part of the Schedule—

the term ‘ oke ’ means one eighth of a kouza or 1.1/8 quarts (as defined in the Weights and Measures Law, 1890).

the term ‘ wholesale ’ means sale or purchase of Methylated spirits in quantities of not less than 10 okes or 1¼ kouzas at any one time or at any single transaction.”

No. 41. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS 1940 TO (No. 1) 1943.

ORDER MADE BY A COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

REPL. S.L. 1944,

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1943, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Movement of Bread) (Control) Order, 1944.

2. In this Order—

“ town ” means the towns of Nicosia, Famagusta, Larnaca, Limassol, Paphos and Kyrenia and includes the area lying within a radius of three miles from the District Court of each town.

3. From and after the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette* and save under a permit issued under my hand or under the hand of the Commissioner of the District, no person shall bring into any town any bread from any place or area outside the town:

Provided that nothing in this clause shall apply to any cut-up bread not exceeding two okes which any person may bring with him into the town for his own consumption.

4. Any bread brought into any town in contravention of clause 3 of this Order may be seized by such person as I, or the Commissioner of the District in which such bread is found, may authorize in writing in that behalf.

5. Any person who acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order, is liable to the penalties prescribed in the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 1) 1943.
