THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO 1944.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1944, I hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Returns of Stocks of Insecticides) Order, 1944.

2. In this Order—

“ Insecticide ” means pyrethrum powder, pyrethrum extracts whether diluted or concentrated and includes all made up fly spray or insecticide whether branded or not.

3. Within four days from the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*, every person who has in his possession or under his control any quantity of insecticide in powder form in excess of 1 kilogram or any quantity of insecticide in liquid form in excess of 2 gallons or 10 litres shall complete and deliver to me a return in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto in respect of the insecticide in his possession or under his control.

4.—(1) From and after the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*, no person who has in his possession or under his control any quantity of insecticide in excess of the quantities mentioned in clause 3 of this Order shall—

(a) consume or make use of ;

(b) sell or otherwise dispose of ;

(c) in any way alter, treat, carry out any process in connection with or use in the preparation or manufacture of any liquid or preparation ;
any quantity of such insecticide whatsoever, save under a special permit issued under my hand or the hand of a Deputy Controller of Medical Supplies.

(2) Every special permit issued under the provisions of sub-clause (1) hereof may contain such terms, limitations and conditions (including the price at which any insecticide may be sold) as may be specified therein.

5. Every person shall permit such person as I may authorize in writing in that behalf, to enter upon and inspect his premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with or for the purpose of checking the correctness or accuracy of any return made under the provisions of clause 3 of this Order.

6. Any person who—

- (a) acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order ;
- (b) makes, under any of the provisions of this Order, any return which is false in any material particular ;
- (c) makes any false statement in any application for a permit under this Order ;
- (d) fails to comply with any term, limitation or condition in any permit issued under this Order ;
- (e) knowingly misleads or otherwise interferes with or impedes any person exercising any powers or performing any duties under the provisions of this Order ;

is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1944.

ORDER MADE BY A COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.
