THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO 1944.

Order made by the Competent Authority under Regulation 61.

REPL. S.L. 1944, 9.6.44, p. 146. In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1944, I hereby order as follows :--1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Wood Burning Heaters Control)

Order, 1944.

2. In this Order-

"Heater" means any steam engine, boiler, furnace, oven, kiln, still or other apparatus using fuelwood for its working as set out in the First Schedule hereto but shall not include any cooking stove or geyser solely used for domestic purposes.

"Fuel and Charcoal Controller" means the person appointed as such under the Defence (Control of Fuel and Charcoal) Orders, 1943.

3.—(1) From and after the date declared by notification in the Gazette by the Fuel and Charcoal Controller no person shall erect, use or work any heater of such type as may be specified in such notification, without a licence from the Fuel and Charcoal Controller.

(2) A licence issued under this Order may contain such conditions as the Fuel and Charcoal Controller may think fit to impose (including a condition that within a certain period to be specified in the licence the heater in respect of which the licence is issued shall be converted from wood burning into oil burning).

(3) A licence for the erection of a heater may be issued or refused at the discretion of the Fuel and Charcoal Controller and may be made valid for such period as to him may seem fit to be specified in the licence.

4. Any person desiring to obtain a licence under this Order shall apply to the Fuel and Charcoal Controller in the form set out in the Second Schedule hereto giving the particulars therein set out.

5. Every holder of a licence issued under this Order shall-

- (a) keep on his premises such books or records and enter therein such matters as the Fuel and Charcoal Controller may from time to time direct;
- (b) complete and deliver to the Fuel and Charcoal Controller a return containing such information and particulars as the Fuel and Charcoal Controller may by notification in the Gazette from time to time direct.

6. Every person shall permit such persons as the Fuel and Charcoal Controller may authorize in writing in that behalf to enter upon his premises or property for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with or for the purpose of checking the correctness or accuracy of any entry made in any books or records kept or any information or particulars given under the provisions of paragraphs (a) and (b) of clause 5 of this Order.
