No. 128. THE COURTS OF JUSTICE LAWS, 1935 TO 1943.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 16 (5).

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 16(5) of the Courts of Justice Laws, 1935 to 1943, do hereby order that Bodamialzade Hussein Ekrem Effendi, while acting as a Magistrate at Lefka or Morphou, be empowered to hear and determine any action in which the amount in dispute or the value of the subject matter does not exceed fifty pounds.

No. 129. THE COMMISSIONS OF ENQUIRY LAW, 1942.

COMMISSION OF ENQUIRY APPOINTED UNDER SECTION 2.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2 of the Commissions of Enquiry Law, 1942, do hereby order as follows:—

No. 130. THE ADULTERATION OF PRODUCE LAWS, 1926 TO 1935.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 10.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 10 of the Adulteration of Produce Laws, 1926 to 1935, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Adulteration of Produce (Amendment) Regulations, 1945, and shall be read as one with the Adulteration of Produce

Regulations, 1935, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Adulteration of Produce Regulations, 1935 and 1945.

2. The Schedule to the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the item relating to carobs and the substitution therefor of the following items:—

Carob kernels	3 per cent.
Carobs in any other form	1 per cent.

No. 131. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO 1945.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 33.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 33 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1945, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Establishments during Municipal Elections) (Paphos) Order, 1945, and shall be read in conjunction with the Defence (Control of Places of Public Resort and Entertainment) (Paphos) Order, 1942, (hereinafter referred to as the "original Order") and the word "establishment" in this Order shall have the same meaning as in the original Order.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph (b) of clause 3 of the original Order, during the 20th day of May, 1945, no intoxicating liquor shall be sold, served, consumed or be in possession or under the control of any person in any establishment or be permitted or suffered to be sold, served or consumed in any establishment within the Municipal limits of the town of Ktima and within the village boundaries of the villages of Khlorakas, Emba, Konia, Anavargos and Yeroskipos in the District of Paphos:

Provided that nothing in this clause contained shall render a person ordinarily in possession or control of intoxicating liquor in an establishment liable to prosecution by reason only of the fact that such person is in possession or control of intoxicating liquor held in an establishment for the purpose of the business carried on in such establishment.

3. Any person who acts in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order is liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1945, and any licence issued to such person in respect of the establishment in which the offence was committed, under the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors Law, 1943, may be cancelled.

4. This Order shall not apply to any establishment operated by, or under the direct control of, His Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Force Authorities.

5. Subject to the provisions of clause 2 of this Order, the original order shall remain in full force and effect.
