

No. 179. THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 TO 1944.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF LAPITHOS.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1944, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Lapithos hereby make the following bye-laws :—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Lapithos) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1945, and shall be read as one with the Municipal Corporation (Lapithos) Bye-laws, 1931 to 1942 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws") and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Lapithos) Bye-laws, 1931 to 1945.

2. Bye-law 17 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

" 17.—(1) The following fees shall be paid by the owner or the person slaughtering any animal in the slaughter-houses, that is to say :—

(a) For every cow or ox not exceeding 30 okes in weight	5	0
(b) For every cow or ox exceeding 30 okes but not exceeding 80 okes in weight	8	0
(c) For every cow or ox exceeding 80 okes in weight	10	0
(d) For every goat or sheep not exceeding 10 okes in weight	1	0
(e) For every goat or sheep exceeding 10 okes but not exceeding 15 okes in weight	1	4½
(f) For every goat or sheep exceeding 15 okes in weight	2	4½
(g) For every kid or lamb not exceeding 10 okes in weight	1	0

(2) Every such fee shall be paid to the inspector."

3. Bye-law 27 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

" 27.—(1) The following tolls shall be paid to the inspector by the owner or the person in charge of any goods, other than fresh fish, meat or pork, brought into or exposed for sale in the municipal market, that is to say :—

(a) When the value of the goods does not exceed 2 shillings	1p.
(b) When the value of the goods exceeds 2 shillings but does not exceed 5 shillings	2p.
(c) When the value of the goods exceeds 5 shillings but does not exceed 10 shillings	3p.
(d) When the value of the goods exceeds 10 shillings but does not exceed 1 pound	4p.

(2) If the value of the goods exceeds 1 pound, a toll of 3p. for each additional pound or fraction thereof shall be added to the aforementioned toll of 4p."

4. Bye-law 38A of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

" 38A.—(1) The following tolls shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, that is to say :—

(a) When the value of the carcass of a sheep, goat, ox or cow or part thereof does not exceed 5 shillings	2p.
(b) When the value of such carcass exceeds 5 shillings but does not exceed 10 shillings	3p.
(c) When the value of such carcass exceeds 10 shillings but does not exceed 1 pound	4p.
(d) When the value of such carcass exceeds 1 pound, a toll of for each additional pound or fraction thereof shall be added to the aforementioned toll of 4p.	4p.

(2) The tolls in paragraph (1) of this bye-law prescribed shall not be payable by any person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, who is a lessee of any shop, stall or space in the meat market under bye-law 20 (2) of these bye-laws.

(3) Every toll payable under this bye-law shall be paid to the inspector."

5. Bye-law 48 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

" 48.—(1) The following tolls shall be paid to the inspector by the owner or the person in charge of any carcass of swine or fresh pork brought into or exposed for sale in the pork market, that is to say :—

(a) When the value of the meat does not exceed 2 shillings	1p.
(b) When the value of the meat exceeds 2 shillings but does not exceed 5 shillings	2p.
(c) When the value of the meat exceeds 5 shillings but does not exceed 10 shillings	3p.
(d) When the value of the meat exceeds 10 shillings but does not exceed 1 pound	4p.

(2) If the value of the meat exceeds 1 pound, a toll of 4p. for each additional pound or fraction thereof shall be added to the aforementioned toll of 4p."

6. Part XII of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following Part substituted therefor :—

“ PART XII.

FEES FOR WEIGHING, MEASURING AND TESTING OF GOODS.

106i. The fees to be paid under the provisions of section 184 of the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to (No. 2) 1943, for the weighing, measuring or testing of goods within the municipal limits shall be the fees set forth in the Schedule to these bye laws.

106j. The fees to be paid under the provisions of section 189 of the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to (No. 2) 1943, in respect of goods brought within the municipal limits shall be the fees set forth in the Schedule to these bye-laws.

107.—(1) Whenever any municipal weigher is requested by any person to weigh, measure or test any goods other than any of the goods enumerated in the Schedule to these bye-laws, such person shall pay to the municipal weigher, for the use of the municipal corporation, upon such weighing, measuring or testing a fee at the rate of two paras per oke in respect thereof :

Provided that :—

(a) Fractions under five paras shall not be collected ;

(b) For fractions of five paras and over and under fifteen paras the sum of ten paras shall be collected ;

(c) For fractions of fifteen paras and over and under twenty paras the sum of twenty paras shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be twenty paras.

(2) Nothing in this bye-law contained—

(a) shall apply or shall be taken to apply to the weighing, measuring or testing of any goods enumerated in the Schedule to these bye-laws ; or

(b) shall be taken or construed to give any municipal weigher or to the municipal corporation any right to demand the compulsory weighing, measuring or testing of any goods to which this bye-law applies.”

7. The principal Bye-laws are hereby amended by the addition immediately after bye-law 116 of the following Schedule :—

Fees shall be calculated on the actual weight of the goods weighed at the above rates : Provided that,

(a) Fractions under 10 paras shall not be collected.

(b) For fractions of 10 paras and over and under 30 paras the sum of 20 paras shall be collected.

(c) For fractions of 30 paras and over and under 40 paras the sum of 40 paras shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be 1p."
