THE HOTELS LAWS, 1935 TO 1943.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 12.

C. C. WOOLLEY,

Governor

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 12 of the Hotels Laws, 1935 to 1943, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Hotels (Amendment) Regulations, 1945, and shall be read as one with the Hotels Regulations, 1935 to (No. 3) 1944, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Hotels Regulations, 1935 to 1945.

- 2. Notwithstanding anything in these Regulations contained the Hotels Board-
- (a) may fix the maximum charges which may be made by a hotel-keeper for drinks to guests staying in or visiting his hotel;
- (b) in the case of camp hotels, may fix the maximum charges which may be made for boarding terms, having regard to the general conditions prevailing at such camp hotel and the manner in which it is kept and managed;
- (c) if, having regard to all the circumstances of the case it considers it fair and equitable, may, by special licence under the hand of the Chairman, permit the hotel keeper of any hotel specified in the licence, being a hotel other than a hotel in class I or II, to charge such boarding terms as may be specified therein notwithstanding that such terms may be in excess of the terms fixed by these regulations in respect of the class of hotels in which such hotel is classified.

THE LAND ACQUISITION LAWS, 1899 TO 1944.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 4.

Whereas it has been represented to me that it is desirable in the public interest to erect a lairage (with the necessary appurtenances thereto) within the District of

^ramagusta.

Now, therefore, I Charles Campbell Woolley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, upon whom has been conferred the Decoration of the Military Cross, by virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 2, 3 and 4 of the Land Acquisition Laws, 1899 to 1944, do hereby declare the erection of the lairage (with the necessary appurtenances thereto) aforesaid to be an undertaking of public utility and do hereby authorize the carrying out of the said undertaking and do hereby entrust to the Director of Public Works the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking.

2. Notification No. 112 published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 28th

April, 1945, is hereby revoked.
