No. 233. THE BANK HOLIDAYS LAW, 1928.

PROCLAMATION MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 6 of the Bank Holidays Law, 1928, and with the advice of the Executive Council, I, Charles Campbell Woolley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, upon whom has been conferred the Decoration of the Military Cross, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, do hereby proclaim that Thursday and Friday the 16th and 17th days of August, 1945, are hereby appointed to be and shall be observed as bank holidays for the purposes of the said Law.

Given at Nicosia, this 15th day of August, 1945.
