THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF SALE PRICES OF SCHEDULED ARTICLES) CONSOLIDATION ORDERS, 1940 TO 1942.

NOTICE No. 176 UNDER CLAUSE 13.

A.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Parts 1 and 2 and the substitution therefor of the following parts, respectively :—

“PART 1.—WHEAT.

B.—The Schedule is hereby amended, with effect from the 13th September, 1945, by the deletion therefrom of Part 22 and the substitution therefor of the following part :—

Modifications : Provided that—

- (a) the price in column (2) shall apply to sales or purchases of not less than 4 tons at any one time or at any single transaction, on condition that purchasers shall provide their own storage;
- (b) where gas oil is delivered at the customers' premises in Nicosia within a radius of 3 miles from the Commissioner's office, the price for quantities exceeding 65 gallons shall be £11. 9s. per metric ton and for quantities of less than 65 gallons the price shall be 3 shillings and 5 piastres per 4 gallons.”

C.—The Schedule is hereby amended, with effect from the 13th September, 1945, by the deletion therefrom of Parts 84 and 85 and the substitution therefor of the following parts, respectively :—

“PART 84.—DIESEL OIL.

- (b) where diesel oil is delivered at the customers' premises in Nicosia within a radius of 3 miles from the Commissioner's office, the price for quantities exceeding 65 gallons shall be £11. 6s. per metric ton.

PART 85.—FURNACE OIL.

- (b) where furnace oil is delivered at the customers' premises in Nicosia within a radius of 3 miles from the Commissioner's office, the price for quantities exceeding 65 gallons shall be £9. 18s. per metric ton."

No. 258. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO 1945.

No. 259. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO 1945.

ORDER MADE BY A COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1945, I hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Olive Kernels) Order, 1945.
2. In this Order—
“olive kernels” means kernels from olives which have not previously been subjected to crushing process in a factory.
- 3.—(1) From and after the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*, no person shall :—
(a) purchase any olive kernels, except under a permit issued under my hand ;
(b) sell any olive kernels except to a person authorized by me in that behalf (hereinafter referred to as “an authorized purchaser”);
(c) remove any olive kernels from the place of pressing of olives except for delivery to an authorized purchaser.
- (2) Every permit issued under the provisions of sub-paragraph (1) hereof may be either general or special and may contain such terms and conditions as may be specified therein.
4. From and after the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*, no person shall use as fuel in any bakery or public bath or any other way any olive kernels.
5. Any person who acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order or of any term or condition contained in any permit issued under this Order, is liable to the penalties prescribed in the Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1945.
