THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY LAWS, 1939 TO 1945.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTIONS 2 (5) AND 9.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2 (5) and 9 of the Trading with the Enemy Laws, 1939 to 1945, (hereinafter referred to as "the Law") do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) (France and Monaco) Order, 1945.
2. For the purposes of this Order—
"France" means Metropolitan France (other than Corsica and Algeria) and the Principality of Monaco.
3. Clauses 3, 6 and 7 of the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Orders, 1940 and 1941, (requiring payment of certain moneys to the Custodian and imposing restrictions and requirements in regard to certain property in the Colony) shall not apply to—
 - (a) any money which would but for the existence of a state of war become payable to or for the benefit of any person within the description contained in clause 4 of this Order on or after the 29th March, 1945;
 - (b) any property which on or after the 29th March, 1945, comes into the ownership of any such person as aforesaid;
 - (c) any money or property to which the above-mentioned clauses would apply only because any such persons as aforesaid became resident or commenced or recommenced to carry on business in France on or after the 25th August, 1944.
4. This Order applies—
 - (a) to any individual resident in France;
 - (b) as respects any business carried on in France to any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on that business;
 - (c) as respects any business carried on in any territory which is neither enemy territory nor an area which is for the time being to be treated as enemy territory for the purposes of section 9 of the Law in accordance with the provisions of section 12A or section 12B of the Law, to any body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on that business if and so long as controlled by any individual resident in, or body of persons carrying on business in, France.
5. This Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 29th March, 1945.

THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1945.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 66.

It is hereby notified that by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 66 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1945, and duly deputed to me, I hereby approve the premises described in the Schedule hereto as private warehouses to be occupied by the Shell Company of Palestine, Ltd., the Socony-Vacuum Oil Company Inc. and Messrs. A. I. Mantacheff & Co. for the warehousing of dutiable petroleum products without payment of import duties upon the first entry of any dutiable petroleum products therein.

2. Any previous notification, relating to the premises described in the Schedule hereto and approving the same as private warehouses, is hereby cancelled.

2. The northern store at Larnaca situated on the right side of the road leading from Larnaca to Famagusta, belonging to the Municipal Corporation of Larnaca.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 66.
