# THE POST OFFICE LAWS, 1881 TO 1933.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2171

### MADE UNDER SECTION 6.

### R. E. TURNBULL,

Acting Governor.

- I, the Acting Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor in Council by section 6 of the Post Office Laws, 1881 to 1933, do hereby order as follows :-
- 1. This Order may be cited as the Parcels Post (Rates of Postage) (Amendment Gazettes: No. 3) Order, 1945, and shall be read as one with the Parcels Post (Rates of Postage) Supplement Orders, 1944 to (No. 2) 1945, (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order"), No. 3: and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Parcels Post (Rates of Postage) Orders, 1944 to (No. 3) 1945.

2. The Schedule to the principal Order is hereby amended as follows:-

- (a) by the addition thereto in their alphabetical order of the new entries set out in the First Schedule hereto;
- (b) by the deletion therefrom of the entries relating to Morocco, Palestine, Syria, Republic of Lebanon and Government of Latakia, and Zanzibar, and the substitution therefor of the entries set out in the Second Schedule hereto.
