**No. 378. THE CUSTOMS (EXPORT DUTY) LAW, 1940
AND
THE CUSTOMS (EXPORT DUTY) LAW, 1940 (AMENDMENT)
REGULATIONS, 1943.**

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2176

I, the Acting Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor in Council by section 5 of the Customs (Export Duty) Law, 1940, as amended by the Customs (Export Duty) Law, 1940 (Amendment) Regulations, 1943, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs (Export Duty) Schedule Amendment Order (No. 2), 1945.

2. The Schedule to the Customs (Export Duty) Law, 1940, is hereby further amended by the insertion therein of the following proviso to item No. 8 (relating to spirits):—

“ Provided that the export duty for eau-de-cologne shall be at the rate of 10 per centum *ad valorem*.”

No. 379. THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE ACTING GOVERNOR.

I, the Acting Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, as extended to the Colony by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940, and the Emergency Powers

(Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1942, and of every other power thereunto enabling, do hereby make the following regulations :—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Defence (Revocation No. 3) Regulations, 1945.

2. The Defence Regulations, 1940 to 1945, are hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the regulations set out in the Schedule hereto, without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.
