

No. 396. THE EMERGENCY POWERS (CYPRUS DEFENCE) (FINANCE) REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 2) 1941.

AUTHORIZATION UNDER REGULATION 4 (2).

I, the Acting Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor by paragraph (2) of regulation 4 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) (Finance) Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1941, do hereby appoint the British Bank set out in the Schedule hereto to be an authorized dealer for the purposes of the aforesaid Regulations and do hereby authorize the said bank, subject to the provisions of the aforesaid Regulations, to deal in the matters set out in paragraph (2) of regulation 4 of the aforesaid Regulations.

2. This authorization is in addition to and not in derogation of the authorization published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 18th October, 1945, under Notification No. 296.

No. 397. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO (No. 2) 1945.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 66.

It is hereby notified that by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 66 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 2) 1945, and duly deputed to me, I hereby approve the premises described in the Schedule hereto as private warehouses to be occupied by the Shell Company of Palestine Limited, the Socony-Vacuum Oil Company Incorporated and Messrs. A. I. Mantacheff & Co. for the warehousing of dutiable petroleum products without payment of import duties upon the first entry of any such products therein.

2. Any previous notification, relating to the premises described in the Schedule hereto and approving the same as private warehouses, is hereby cancelled.

No. 398. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 3) 1945.

ORDER MADE BY THE CONTROLLER OF TRANSPORT UNDER REGULATION 55 (1) (c).
In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by regulation 55 (1) (c) of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 3) 1945, which were duly delegated to me by the Order of the Governor dated the 17th day of June, 1942, and published under Notification No. 224 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 18th June, 1942, I, Philip Patrick Taylor, Controller of Transport, do hereby make the following order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Charges for Carriage of Passengers and Goods by Motor Vehicles) Consolidation (Amendment) Order, 1945, and shall be read as one with the Defence (Charges for Carriage of Passengers and Goods by Motor Vehicles) Consolidation Order, 1944 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Defence (Charges for Carriage of Passengers and Goods by Motor Vehicles) Consolidation Orders, 1944 and 1945.

2. The proviso to paragraph (1) of clause 2 of the principal Order is hereby deleted.
