No. 114. THE SHOP ASSISTANTS LAWS, 1942 AND 1945.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2187

MADE UNDER SECTION 19.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 19 of the Shop Assistants Laws, 1942 and 1945, do hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Shop Assistants (Barbers, Hair-dressers and Restaurant employees) Order, 1946. Short title.

2.—(1) Barber and hairdresser shops shall, in lieu of the hours set out in section 4 of the Law— Barbers and Hairdressers.

(a) in the months of May to October (both months inclusive) in every year, be closed as follows :—

(i) from Monday to Friday (both days inclusive) in every week, not later than 8 p.m. ;

(ii) on Saturday in every week, not later than 10 p.m. ;

(b) in the months of November in every year to April of the following year (both months inclusive), be closed as follows :—

(i) from Monday to Friday (both days inclusive) in every week, not later than 7 p.m. ;

(ii) on Saturday in every week, not later than 9 p.m.

(2) In all cases barber and hairdresser shops shall, after closing as in paragraph (1) hereof provided, remain closed and shall not reopen earlier than 5 o'clock on the following morning.

3. In the case of persons employed at restaurants, such persons shall, on at least one day in each week, have a holiday after 2 p.m. in lieu of 1 p.m. as provided by section 8 of the Law. Restaurant employees.
