No. 141. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO (No. 2) 1945.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2191

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 2) 1945, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Certain Mining Material) Exemption Order, 1946.

2. From and after the 18th April, 1946, and until further order the following goods, if proved to the satisfaction of the Comptroller to be imported solely for use underground in any mine of the importer, shall be admitted into the Colony free from all import duties:—

(a) sawn and round timber of any dimensions;

(b) expanded metal and steel to be used in stoping operations. → *REPL. S.L. 1947,*

No. 144. THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY A COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of Defence Regulation 61 as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Agricultural Produce Control) Order, 1946.

2. In this Order:—

- ← "Agricultural Produce" means barley, wheat and vetches;
- "Producer" means any person who since the 1st September, 1945, has cultivated and produced any agricultural produce either by his own labour or through his agents or servants;
- "Agricultural Produce Controller" means an officer appointed by His Excellency the Governor as Agricultural Produce Controller.
- "Agricultural Produce Control Officer" means a person or Co-operative Society appointed as such by the Agricultural Produce Controller;
