THE CYPRUS VOLUNTEER FORCE LAWS, 1940 TO 1944.

PROCLAMATION MADE UNDER SECTION 11A.

I, Charles Campbell Woolley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, upon whom has been conferred the decoration of the Military Cross, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, in exercise of the powers vested in me by section 11A of the Cyprus Volunteer Force Laws, 1940 to 1944, and of every other power hereunto enabling, do hereby by this Proclamation order and proclaim that all officers and other ranks who have been placed from time to time on the Reserve of the Cyprus Volunteer Force and who are still on the Reserve on the date of this Proclamation shall be demobilized.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Colony at Nicosia this 29th day of April, 1946.
