

No. 22. THE ELEMENTARY EDUCATION LAWS, 1933 TO 1944.

PRESCRIPTION OF SENIOR POSTS, DUTY ALLOWANCES, ADDITIONAL QUALIFICATIONS AND SPECIAL ALLOWANCES UNDER SECTIONS 34 AND 35.

I, the Acting Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor by sections 34 and 35 of the Elementary Education Laws, 1933 to 1944, do hereby order and prescribe as follows :—

1. The posts shewn in the second column of the Schedule hereto shall be senior posts carrying the duty allowances shewn in the third column, respectively.

2. Any teacher possessing academic or professional qualifications in addition to his ordinary qualifications as a teacher may receive a special allowance of £12 per annum in respect of each additional qualification, provided that—

- (a) the studies on which the teacher bases his claim must have been undertaken with the approval of the Director and have been such as to increase the teacher's efficiency or value as a schoolmaster;
- (b) in order to undertake these studies, the teacher must have sacrificed at least one year's service or one year's salary as a schoolmaster :
Provided that this sub-paragraph shall not apply in the case of teachers trained under an approved scholarship scheme;
- (c) no teacher shall receive special allowances exceeding £24 per annum, in the aggregate ;
- (d) the allowance shall be drawn only so long as the teacher shews that he is using the additional qualifications for the good of the service :

Provided that nothing in this sub-paragraph shall prevent any teacher from drawing such allowance if such teacher, owing to the exigencies of the service, is appointed to any post in which he has no opportunity or occasion for using his additional qualifications.

3. These prescriptions shall be deemed to have been made and to have come into operation on the 1st January, 1944.

SCHEDULE—(Paragraph 1.)

	Post.	Duty allowance.
1	Headmasters, grade I schools, <i>i.e.</i> schools with 6 or more teachers	£36 per annum.
2	Headmasters, grade II schools, <i>i.e.</i> schools with 4 or 5 teachers	£24 per annum.
3	Headmasters, grade III schools, <i>i.e.</i> schools with 3 teachers	£12 per annum.
4	Asst. Headmasters, grade I schools, <i>i.e.</i> schools with 6 or more teachers	£12 per annum.
5	Headmistresses, grade I schools, <i>i.e.</i> girls' schools with 6 or more mistresses	£27 per annum.
6	Headmistresses, grade II schools, <i>i.e.</i> girls' schools with 4 or 5 mistresses	£18 per annum.
7	Headmistresses, grade III schools, <i>i.e.</i> girls' schools with 3 mistresses	£9 per annum.
8	Asst. Headmistresses, grade I schools, <i>i.e.</i> girls' schools with 6 or more mistresses	£9 per annum.
9	Senior Asst. Mistresses, in mixed schools under a Headmaster with either 6 teachers or 3 assistant mistresses	£6 per annum.
