THE MISSIONARY EDUCATIONAL AND MEDICAL (ALIEN REGULATION) LAWS, 1922 AND 1933.

### PERMIT UNDER SECTION 8.

Whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Laws, 1922 and 1933, the persons whose names appear in the Schedule hereto have applied for permits under the provisions of the said Laws;

And whereas the said persons have severally given an undertaking in writing to pay all due obedience and respect to the Government of Cyprus, and while carefully abstaining from participation in political affairs, that they desire and purpose *ex animo* to work in friendly co-operation with the said Government in all matters in which their influence might properly be exerted; and, in particular, they have undertaken that if engaged in educational work, their influence will be exerted to promote loyalty to the Government of Cyprus in the minds of their pupils and to make them good citizens of the British Empire;
