- I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Motor Car Laws, 1921 to 1945, do hereby make the following regulations:-
- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Motor Car (Amendment) Regulations, 1946, and shall be read as one with the Motor Car Regulations. lations, 1930 to (No. 2) 1945, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations "), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Motor Car Regulations, 1930 to 1946.

- 2. Regulation 22 of the principal Regulations shall be amended as follows:-
 - (a) by the deletion therefrom of paragraph (1) and the substitution therefor of the following paragraph:-
 - "(1) Save with the licence of the Colonial Secretary—
 - (a) the extreme width of the lorry shall not exceed 7 feet; and
 - (b) the extreme length of the lorry shall not exceed 21 feet.";
 - (b) by the deletion in paragraph 6 thereof of the figure "58" and the substitution therefor of the figure "60".
