THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 TO 1945.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF PAPHOS.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1945, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Paphos hereby make the following bye-laws :—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Paphos Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1946, and shall be read as one with the Paphos Municipal Bye-laws, 1943 to 1945, (hereinafter referred to as “ the principal bye-laws ”) and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Paphos Municipal Bye-laws, 1943 to 1946.

2. Bye-law 26 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 26. The following fees shall be paid by the owner of or the person slaughtering any animal in the slaughter-house, that is to say :—

(a) for every cow, ox, bull, camel, not exceeding 30 okes in weight	s. p. 5 0
(b) for every cow, ox, bull, camel exceeding 30 okes in weight	8 0
(c) for every sheep or goat	2 2
(d) for every lamb or kid from 1st January to 30th April (both days inclusive)	1 6
(e) for every lamb or kid from 1st May to 31st December (both days inclusive)	2 2
(f) for every swine (gourounia) not exceeding 10 okes in weight	3 0
(g) for every swine weighing from 10 to 40 okes	6 0
(h) for every swine exceeding 40 okes in weight	8 0.”

3. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 84 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—

“(1) The following fees shall be paid to the inspector by the person in charge of any animal brought to the animal market, that is to say:—

Provided that whenever the owner or any person in charge of any of the animals to which this sub-paragraph (f) applies, exposes for sale in the animal market any such animals of over 10 in number, at any one time, a fee of 3p. shall be paid in respect of every such animal, over and above the said number.”

4. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 144 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—

“(1) The following fees shall be paid for the removal of buckets or receptacles containing night soil or urine, within the municipal limits that is to say:—

- (a) For every bucket or receptacle of night soil from a house or other premises for a period of one month, 5 shillings.
- (b) For every bucket or receptacle of urine from any house, shop or other premises for a period of one month, a fee not exceeding 5 shillings to be determined in each case by the Mayor.”

5. Bye-law 213 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor:—

“213. There shall be paid to the town clerk and treasurer for a licence under this part a fee, to be determined, in each case, by the Council, of not less than £3 and of not more than £24 for every year or part thereof.”

6. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 214 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—

“(1)—(a) The Council shall charge a duty (hereinafter in this part called ‘entertainment duty’) on all payments made for admission to any public entertainment.

(b) The entertainment duty shall be at the following rates, that is to say:—

(i) On each ticket the total price of which does not exceed 2 piastres	p. 0½
(ii) On each ticket the total price of which exceeds two piastres but does not exceed 4½ piastres	1
(iii) On each ticket the total price of which exceeds 4½ piastres but does not exceed 7 piastres	1½
(iv) On each ticket the total price of which exceeds 7 piastres but does not exceed 12 piastres	2
(v) On each ticket the total price of which exceeds 12 piastres but does not exceed 2 shillings	2½
(vi) On each ticket the total price of which exceeds 2 shillings but does not exceed 3 shillings	3
(vii) On each ticket the total price of which exceeds 3 shillings but does not exceed 4 shillings	4
(viii) On each ticket the total price of which exceeds 4 shillings but does not exceed 5 shillings	5
(ix) On each ticket the total price of which exceeds 5 shillings but does not exceed 6 shillings	6
(x) On each ticket the total price of which is over 6 shillings	7

(c) The entertainment duty shall be levied by affixing the seal of the Municipal Corporation on the counterfoil receipts of the tickets of admission."

7. Paragraphs (2), (3) and (4) of bye-law 250 of the principal Bye-laws are hereby repealed and the following paragraphs substituted therefor:—

"(2) No person shall in the Ioannis Metaxas Street lead, ride, drive or take any animal or vehicle in the direction leading from Ioannis Metaxas Square through the said street.

(3) The Council shall place or cause to be placed—

(a) near the entrance to the Scholion Street by the wall of the 'Dimitrion Parthenagoghion' and near the Agridhia bridge sign posts notifying the public of the prohibition in paragraph (1) of this bye-law;

(b) at the entrance of the Ioannis Metaxas street a sign post indicating the direction in which animals and vehicles may move along the said street, as in paragraph (2) of this bye-law provided.

(4) In this part of these bye-laws—

'vehicle' means any carriage, cart, cycle, motor-car, motor-cycle, motor-lorry, motor-omnibus, tractor and any other conveyance constructed for conveying or carrying persons or goods; 'animal' means any camel, ass, horse, mule, cow, gamoose, goat, kid, lamb, sheep or swine.

(5) Nothing in this part of these bye-laws shall apply to—

(a) any vehicle propelled or drawn by hand;

(b) any vehicle used by the Municipal Corporation for the purpose of watering any trees along the area or for cleaning the areas, referred to in paragraphs (1) and (2) of this bye-law."

8. Bye-law 267 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor:—

"267. There shall be paid to the town clerk and treasurer in every year by any person keeping any of the following places or buildings, within the municipal limits, the fee determined by the Council, set out against each—

(a) for every khan or public stable	..	from	5s. to	100s.
(b) for every tannery	20s. ..	100s.
(c) for any place or building kept for the purpose of drying or storing skins	5s. ..	40s.
(d) for any farrier's shop	2s. ..	10s.

fractions under 5 paras shall not be collected.

for fractions of 5 paras and over and under 15 paras the sum of 10 paras shall be collected.

for fractions of 15 paras and over and under 20 paras the sum of 20 paras shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be 1p."

THE IRRIGATION DIVISIONS (VILLAGES) LAWS, 1938 AND 1944.

In pursuance of the provisions of section 19 of the Irrigation Divisions (Villages) Laws, 1938 and 1944, the following rules made by the Committee of the Irrigation Division of Kilani, in the District of Limassol, are published in the *Gazette*. (M.P.749/28.)

IRRIGATION DIVISION OF KILANI.

Rules.

1. These rules may be cited as the Irrigation Division of Kilani (Amendment) Rules, 1946, and shall be read as one with the Irrigation Division of Kilani Rules, 1932 and 1944 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Rules") and the principal Rules and these rules may together be cited as the Irrigation Division of Kilani Rules, 1932 to 1946.

2. Rule 5 of the principal Rules is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "90 piastres" and the substitution therefor of the words "one hundred shillings".
