In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 4) 1945, I hereby order as

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Medical Supplies) Gazettes: (Amendment) Order, 1946, and shall be read as one with the Defence Supplement (Medical Supplies) Orders, 1943 and 1944, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Defence (Medical Supplies) Orders, 1943 to 1946.

2. Clause 7 of the principal Order is hereby deleted.

3. The principal Order is hereby amended by the insertion therein

immediately after clause 5 of the following clause:--

"5A.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in clauses 4 and 5 of this Order contained, the Controller or a Deputy Controller may grant a permit to any person, not being a chemist and druggist or village retailer, to import, deal with, sell or have in his possession or under his control medical supplies;
