THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 TO 1945.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF KARAVAS.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1945, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Karavas hereby make the following Bye-laws:-

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Karavas) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1946, and shall be read as one with the Municipal Corporation (Karavas) Bye-laws, 1932, (hereinafter referred Gazettes: to as "the principal Bye-laws") and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Karavas) Bye-laws, 1932 to 1946.

2. Bye-law 17 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the 20. 1.1939

"27.—(1) The following tolls shall be paid to the inspector by the owner or the person in charge of any goods, other than fresh fish, meat or pork, brought into or exposed for sale in the municipal market, that is to say:

(a) When the value of the goods does not exceed two 1p.(b) When the value of the goods exceeds two shillings but does not exceed five shillings ..... (c) When the value of the goods exceeds five shillings but does not exceed ten shillings ... (d) When the value of the goods exceeds ten shillings but does not exceed one pound ...

(2) If the value of the goods exceeds one pound, a toll of 4p. for each additional pound or fraction thereof shall be added to the aforementioned toll of 4p. 4. Bye-law 37 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor:-"37.—(1) The following tolls shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, that is to say :-(a) When the value of the carcass of a sheep, goat, ox or cow or part thereof does not exceed five 2p. (b) When the value of such carcass exceeds five shillings but does not exceed ten shillings 3p. (c) When the value of such carcass exceeds ten shillings but does not exceed one pound (d) When the value of such carcass exceeds one pound, there shall be added to the aforementioned toll of 4p., for each additional pound or fraction thereof a toll of 4p.(2) The tolls in paragraph (1) of this bye-law prescribed shall not be payable by any person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, who is a lessee of any shop, stall or space in the meat market under bye-law 30 (2) of these bye-laws. (3) Every toll payable under this bye-law shall be paid to the inspector." 5. The following bye-law is hereby inserted immediately after bye-law

6. The following Part and bye-laws are hereby inserted immediately after bye-law 125 of the principal Bye-laws:-

## "PART XV.

Fees for weighing, measuring and testing of goods.

125A. The fees to be paid under the provisions of sections 184 and 189 of the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1945, for the weighing, measuring or testing of goods within the municipal limits shall be

the fees set forth in the Schedule to these bye-laws.

125B.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2) hereof, whenever any municipal weigher is requested by any person to weigh, measure or test any goods other than any of the goods enumerated in the Schedule to these byelaws, such person shall pay to the municipal weigher, for the use of the municipal corporation, upon such weighing, measuring or testing a fee at the rate of two paras per oke in respect thereof:-

Provided that:

37 of the principal Bye-laws:-

(a) fractions under five paras shall not be collected;

(b) for fractions of five paras and over and under fifteen paras the sum of ten paras shall be collected;

(c) for fractions of fifteen paras and over and under twenty paras the sum of twenty paras shall be collected:

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be twenty paras.

- (2) Nothing in this bye-law contained:—
  (a) shall apply or shall be taken to apply to the weighing, measuring or testing of any goods enumerated in the Schedule to these bye-laws; or
  - (b) shall be taken or construed to give any municipal weigher or to the municipal corporation any right to demand the compulsory weighing, measuring or testing of any goods to which this bye-law applies."

# No. 347. The Irrigation Divisions (Villages) Laws, 1938 and 1944.

IRRIGATION DIVISION OF TRAKHYPEDHOULA.

### Rules.

1. These Rules may be cited as the Irrigation Division of Trakhypedhoula Rules, 1946.
