No. 355. THE PRISON DISCIPLINE LAW, 1879.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 4.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Prison Discipline Law, 1879, do hereby make the following regulations :—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Prison (Amendment) Regulations, 1946, and shall be read as one with the Prison Regulations, 1945, (hereinafter referred to as “ the principal Regulations ”), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Prison Regulations, 1945 and 1946.

2. Regulations 116 and 117 of the principal Regulations are hereby revoked and the following regulations substituted therefor, respectively :—

“ Executions, 116.—(1) Unless otherwise directed by the Governor, all executions shall take place within the Central Prison, Nicosia, in the presence of the Commissioner of the District in which the Assize Court sat for the trial of the condemned prisoner.

The Superintendent of Prisons shall be responsible for all arrangements in connection with, and shall superintend and be also present at, every execution.

(2) Except for the Commissioner of the District as in paragraph (1) hereof provided, no person shall enter the part of the Central Prison set apart for condemned prisoners prior to their execution, save with the permission in writing of the Superintendent of Prisons.

117.—(1) The body of an executed prisoner may, at the request of any of his relatives, be delivered to him for burial :

Provided that the Superintendent of Prisons shall refuse to deliver the body as aforesaid if he has reason to believe that any unseemly demonstration is likely to take place in connection with the same or the funeral or burial.

(2) If no relative makes request for the delivery to him of the body or if the Superintendent of Prisons has refused to deliver the same, as in paragraph (1) provided, then in every such case the Superintendent of Prisons shall cause the body to be buried within the precincts of the prison or at such other place as to him may seem fit.”
