No. 364. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO (No. 2) 1945.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2209

MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 2) 1945, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Import Duty (American Joint Distribution Committee) Exemption Order, 1946.

2. All goods imported by the American Joint Distribution Committee proved to the satisfaction of the Comptroller of Customs to be solely for use in any place of detention of illegal immigrants detained under the Detention (Illegal Immigrants) Laws, 1946, shall be admitted into the Colony free from all import duties.

3. This Order shall be deemed to have been made on the 1st day of September, 1946.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 65 (b) of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 2) 1945, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Wharfage Dues (American Joint Distribution Committee) Exemption Order, 1946.

2. All goods imported by the American Joint Distribution Committee proved to the satisfaction of the Comptroller of Customs to be solely
