## THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 TO 1945.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION  
OF FAMAGUSTA.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1945, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Famagusta hereby make the following bye-laws :—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Famagusta Municipal (Amendment No. 2) Bye-laws, 1946, and shall be read as one with the Famagusta Municipal Bye-laws, 1940 to 1946, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws"), and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Famagusta Municipal Bye-laws, 1940 to (No. 2) 1946.

2. The Third Schedule to the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Bye-laws of the 3rd July, 1944), is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of items 57, 58 and 59 and the substitution therefor of the following items, respectively :—
