No. 422.**THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAWS, 1936 TO 1943.**

In pursuance of the provisions of section 9 (1) of the Public Health (Villages) Laws, 1936 to 1943, the following rules made by the Village Health Commission of Pakhna, in the District of Limassol, and approved by the Commissioner, are published in the *Gazette*.

RULES MADE BY THE VILLAGE HEALTH COMMISSION OF PAKHNA
UNDER SECTION 9.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 9 of the Public Health (Villages) Laws, 1936 to 1943, the Village Health Commission of Pakhna hereby make the following rules:—

1. These rules may be cited as the Village Health (Pakhna) (Amendment) Rules, 1946, and shall be read as one with the Village Health (Pakhna) Rules, 1938, (hereinafter called "the principal Rules"), *Gazette: 29.7.38.*

and the principal Rules and these rules may together be cited as the Village Health (Pakhna) Rules, 1938 and 1946.

2. The following rules shall be substituted for rules 20 and 46 respectively of the principal Rules :—

“ *Rule 20.* The following fees shall be paid by the owner of or the person slaughtering any animal in a slaughter-house, that is to say :—

- (a) For every goat, kid, lamb or sheep 1s.
- (b) For every bullock, camel, cow or ox over 40 okes in weight 4s.
- (c) For every bullock, camel, cow or ox under 40 okes in weight 2s.
- (d) For every swine over 30 okes in weight 4s.
- (e) For every swine under 30 okes in weight 2s.

Rule 46.—(1) The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, that is to say :—

- (a) For every carcass of sheep or goat or part thereof . . 4p.
- (b) For every carcass of a young lamb or kid or part thereof 4p.
- (c) For every carcass of ox, camel, cow or bullock or part thereof 1s.

(2) The fees in paragraph (1) of this rule prescribed shall not be payable by any person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, who is a monthly or yearly lessee of any shop, stall or place in the meat market under rule 45 of these Rules.”

3. Part I of the Schedule to the principal Rules is hereby amended by the insertion therein of the following rules immediately after Rule 48 :—

“ *Chapter 3.—Pork Market.*

49. The Village Health Commission may from time to time by public notification appoint any premises or place within the area of the village to be the pork market.

50. No person shall sell or expose for sale within the area of the village any carcass of swine or any pork, except at the pork market.

51. The management and control of the pork market are hereby vested in the person appointed from time to time by the Village Health Commission to be the Inspector of the pork market (hereinafter in this chapter of these rules referred to as “ the Inspector ”), subject to the instructions which he may from time to time receive from the Village Health Commission.

52. All carcasses of swine and all fresh pork exposed for sale in the pork market, shall be open at all times to inspection by the Village Health Commission, the Medical Officer and the Inspector.

53. All carcasses of swine and all fresh pork exposed for sale in the pork market, which in the opinion of the Medical Officer or the Village Health Commission are unfit for human consumption may be seized and destroyed by the Inspector.

54.—(1) The following fee shall be paid by the owner of or the person exposing for sale any carcass of swine or fresh pork in the pork market, that is to say :—

- (a) For every carcass of swine or part thereof or portion of fresh pork up to 30 okes 1s.
- (b) For every carcass of swine or part thereof or portion of fresh pork over 30 okes 2s.

(2) Every such fee shall be paid to the Inspector.”

4. Part II of the Schedule to the principal Rules is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words “ Rules 1, 2, 21, 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 78 and 81 ” and the substitution therefor of the words “ Rules 1, 2, 21, 55, 56, 57, 58, 78 and 81 ”.
