No. 18. **THE LAND ACQUISITION LAWS, 1899 TO 1947.**

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 4.

WINSTER,
Governor.

Whereas it has been represented to me that it is desirable in the public interest to establish a Military Receiving Station in the villages of Akhyritou and Dherinia, in the District of Famagusta, the cost whereof is to be borne by His Majesty's Military Authorities.

Now, therefore, I, Reginald Thomas Herbert, Baron Winster of Witherslack, Privy Counsellor, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, in exercise of the powers vested in me by sections 2, 3 and 4 of the Land Acquisition Laws, 1899 to 1947, do hereby declare the establishment of a Military Receiving Station as aforesaid to be an undertaking of public utility and do hereby authorize the carrying out of the said undertaking and do hereby entrust the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking to Major Jack Hunter Wallace, Deputy Assistant Director of Hirings and Disposals (Fixed Assets), H.Q., Cyprus District.
