### THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 TO 1945.

Bye-laws made by the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Akanthou.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1945, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Akanthou hereby make the following bye-laws :----

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Akanthou) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Municipal Corporation (Akanthou) Bye-laws, 1931 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws"), and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Akanthou) Bye-laws, 1931 and 1948.

2. Bye-law 17 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following bye-law substituted therefor :---

"17. The following fees shall be paid to the inspector by the owner of or the person slaughtering any animal in the slaughter-house, that is to say :---

3. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 27 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following paragraph substituted therefor :---

"(1) The following tolls shall be paid by the owner or the person in charge of any goods brought into or on sale in the municipal market : --

(i) When the value of such goods does not exceed 2s. . 1

- (ii) When the value of such goods exceeds 2s, but does not exceed 5s ...
- (iv) When the value of such goods exceeds 10s. but does not exceed £1
- (v) When the value of such goods exceeds  $\pounds l$ , a toll of lp. for each additional 5s. or fraction thereof shall be added to the toll of 4p. mentioned in (iv) above."

4. Bye-law 46 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following bye-law substituted therefor :---

"46. The following tolls shall be paid to the inspector by the owner of or the person exposing for sale any carcass of swine or fresh pork in the pork market, that is to say :---

- (a) for every carcass of a swine or part thereof or portion
  - of fresh pork not exceeding 5 okes in weight  $\dots$
- (b) for each additional oke (over 5 okes) or part thereof 1."

5. Bye-law 55 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

- (i) When the value of such fresh fish does not exceed 4s. per oke, 1p. for every oke or fraction thereof;
- (ii) When the value of such fresh fish exceeds 4s. but does not exceed 6s. per oke, 2p. for every oke or fraction thereof;
- (iii) When the value of such fresh fish exceeds 6s. per oke, 3p. for every oke or fraction thereof."

6. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 60 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following paragraph substituted therefor :---

"(1) The following tolls shall be paid by the owner of or the person exposing for sale cattle in the cattle market :---
