NOTIFICATION UNDER THE POST OFFICE LAWS, 1881 TO 1933.

E. ST. J. JACKSON,

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by the Post Office Laws, 1881 to 1933, His Excellency the Acting Governor, on the representation of the Postmaster-General, has been pleased to give the following directions :—

1. On and from the 1st of August, 1948, the limit of weight for printed papers conveyed by post to all destinations abroad shall be $6\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. (Printed volumes sent singly may weigh as much as 11 lbs.)
2. Notification No. 110 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* No. 2924 of the 14th May, 1941, is hereby cancelled so far as it relates to the limits of weight for printed papers.

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 11.

Notice is hereby given that, with the approval of the Conservator of Forests, the forest set out in the Schedule hereto has been placed for a term of one year as from the 1st August, 1948, under the protection, control and management of the Government in accordance with Section 11 of the Forest Law, 1939.

Forest (including all plantations and trees) belonging to Captain Alan Graham of England, situated near the village of Lythrodhonda, locality Profitis Elias, in the District of Nicosia.
