THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAWS, 1936 TO 1948.

The following rules made by the Village Health Commission of Arakapas, in the District of Limassol, and approved by the Commissioner, are published in the *Gazette*.

RULES MADE BY THE VILLAGE HEALTH COMMISSION OF ARAKAPAS UNDER SECTION 9.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 9 of the Public Health (Villages) Laws, 1936 to 1948, the Village Health Commission of Arakapas hereby make the following rules :—

1. These rules may be cited as the Village Health (Arakapas) (Amendment) Rules, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Village Health (Arakapas) Rules, 1938, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Rules"), and the principal Rules and these rules may together be cited as the Village Health (Arakapas) Rules, 1938 and 1948.

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2. The following rules shall be substituted for rules 20 and 46, respectively, of the principal Rules :—

" *Rule 20.* The following fees shall be paid by the owner of, or the person slaughtering, any animal in a slaughter-house, that is to say :—

Rule 46.—(1) The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, that is to say :—

(a) For every carcass of goat, kid, lamb, sheep, swine or part thereof 4*p.*

(b) For every carcass of bullock, camel, cow, ox or part thereof 6*p.*

(2) The fees in paragraph (1) of this rule prescribed shall not be payable by any person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, who is a monthly or yearly lessee of any shop, stall or place in the meat market under rule 45 of these Rules.”

3. Part I of the Schedule to the principal Rules is hereby amended by the insertion therein of the following rules immediately after Rule 48 :—

“ *Chapter 4.—Market of Foodstuffs.*

Rule 55. The Village Health Commission may from time to time appoint any premises or place within the area of the village to be the market of foodstuffs.

Rule 56. The management and control of the market of foodstuffs are hereby vested in the person appointed from time to time by the Village Health Commission to be the Inspector of the market of foodstuffs (hereinafter in this chapter of these Rules referred to as ‘ the Inspector ’), subject to the instructions which he may from time to time receive from the Village Health Commission.

Rule 57.—(1) The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any foodstuffs in the market of foodstuffs, that is to say :—

(b) foodstuffs valued over 3 shillings but not exceeding 10 shillings	—	4
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(c) foodstuffs valued over 10 shillings but not exceeding £1	—	6

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(e) for every motor-lorry of foodstuffs	4	0
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(2) The fees in this rule prescribed shall be paid to the Inspector.

Rule 58. In this chapter of these Rules the term ‘ foodstuffs ’ means any marketable commodities, articles, things or liquids used for human consumption but does not include any perishable goods or fresh meat or fresh pork.”
