No. 27. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO (No. 2) 1948.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2277
MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 2) 1948, and of every other power thereunto enabling, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This order may be cited as the Import Duties (Exemptions) Revocation Order, 1948.

2. All Orders hitherto in force made under section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 2) 1948, making provision for exemptions from payment of import duty are revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.

No. 28. THE LAND ACQUISITION LAWS, 1899 TO 1947.

REVOCATION OF A NOTIFICATION.
