## THE QUARANTINE LAW, 1932.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2316  
MADE UNDER SECTION 6.WINSTER,  
Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 6 of the Quarantine Law, 1932, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Quarantine (Amendment) Regulations, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Quarantine Regulations, 1932 to 1946 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Quarantine Regulations, 1932 to 1948.

2. Paragraph (2) of regulation 4 of the principal Regulations is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

"(2)—(i) The master of every vessel arriving at any port in Cyprus from any foreign port shall ascertain the state of health of all persons on board and shall fill in and sign a declaration of health in the form set out in the First Schedule to these regulations, such form to be countersigned by the ship's surgeon, if one is carried thereon.

(ii) The master shall deliver the declaration of health to the Port Health Officer and such officer shall peruse the answers to the questions in the declaration and make such further enquiries of the master as may appear to him necessary.

(iii) Where it appears to the Port Health Officer from the answers to the questions in a declaration of health or from the answers to the enquiries made by him or otherwise that there was no dangerous infectious disease on board during the voyage or on arrival of the vessel and that the vessel had not called at any infected local area or had direct intercourse during the voyage with any ship from an infected local area having on board any dangerous infectious disease, such officer shall grant pratique to the vessel."

3. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after regulation 5 of the following regulation 5A:—

"5A.—(1) The master of any ship coming from a foreign port and fitted with a suitable wireless transmitting apparatus, on approaching a port in Cyprus shall, if any person on board has symptoms which may be indicative of an infectious disease other than tuberculosis or if there are any circumstances requiring the attention of a Medical Officer, send to the Director of Medical and Health Services, either directly or through an agent approved by him, a wireless message embodying such of the items of information set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations as are applicable.

(2) Any wireless message so required to be sent shall be sent so as to reach the Director of Medical and Health Services not more than 12 and not less than 4 hours before the time on which the ship is expected to arrive at port.

(3) Any message in wireless code delivered to the Director of Medical and Health Services shall, unless otherwise provided in the notice published pursuant to paragraph (1) of this regulation, conform with the section relating to routine quarantine messages of the 1931 International Code of Signals."

4. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after regulation 23 of the following regulation 23A:—

"23A. The Port Health Officer may take, after disembarkation, the measures which he considers appropriate to ensure the surveillance or observation of persons arriving on a vessel coming from or touching

at any place declared by the Governor to be an infected local area, who are not protected to the satisfaction of such officer, by inoculation or vaccination against the disease for which such area was declared as infected."

5. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the First Schedule thereto and the substitution therefor of the following Schedule :—
