No. 68. THE COURTS OF JUSTICE LAWS, 1935 TO 1947.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 16 (5).

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 16 (5) of the Courts of Justice Laws, 1935 to 1947, do hereby order that Hakkı Suleiman Effendi, while acting as a Magistrate at Lefka and Morphou, be empowered to hear and determine any action in which the amount in dispute or the value of the subject matter does not exceed fifty pounds.

No. 69. THE LAND ACQUISITION LAWS, 1899 TO 1947.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 4.

Whereas it has been represented to me that it is desirable in the public interest to establish a Military Receiving Station in or near the villages of Akhyritou, Dherinia and Phrenaros in the District of Famagusta, the cost whereof is to be borne by His Majesty's Military Authorities.

Now, therefore, I, Reginald Thomas Herbert, Baron Winster of Witherslack, Privy Counsellor, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, by virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 2, 3 and 4 of the Land Acquisition Laws, 1899 to 1947, do hereby declare the establishment of a Military Receiving Station as aforesaid to be an undertaking of public utility and do hereby authorize the carrying out of the said undertaking and do hereby entrust the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking to ~~Major-Jack-Hunter Wallace~~, Deputy Assistant Director of Hirings and Disposals (Fixed Assets), H.Q., Cyprus District, *for the time being.*

2. The Notification published under No. 18 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 22nd January, 1948, on the same subject is hereby revoked.
