### THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 TO 1945.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF POLIS.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1945, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Polis hereby make the following bye-laws :—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Polis) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Municipal Corporation (Polis) Bye-laws, 1931 to 1936 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws), and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Polis) Bye-laws, 1931 to 1948.

2. Bye-law 17 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :---

"49. The following fees shall be paid to the inspector by the owner or the person in charge of any carcass of swine or fresh pork brought for sale into the Pork Market, that is to say :-

6. Bye-law 58 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :-

"58. The owner or the person in charge of any fresh fish brought for sale into the Fish Market shall pay to the inspector a fee of 3p. for every oke or part thereof:

Provided that in case of large quantities and mean cheap fish the inspector may collect 1p. for every oke or part thereof."

7. The principal Bye-laws are hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after bye-law 58g of the following Chapter and bye-laws :---

#### "CHAPTER 4B.—Animal Market.

58H. The Council may by a public notification in that behalf by the Mayor allot a special place to be a market of the sale of animals (hereinafter in this Chapter referred to as 'Animal Market').

581. After the publication of a notification, as in bye-law 58A provided, no person shall sell or expose for sale within the municipal limits any animal except at the Animal Market.

58J. The Animal Market shall be under the management and control of the person appointed from time to time by the Council to be the inspector of such market (hereinafter in this Chapter referred to as 'the inspector'), subject to any instructions which he may from time to time receive from the Mayor.

58K. The Animal Market shall be opened and shall be kept open daily from sunrise to sunset except on Sundays.

58L. All animals exposed for sale in the Animal Market shall—

- (a) stand or be enclosed in such paddock or other part or places of the Animal Market as shall be reserved for the sale of animals of its class or in such other part or place of the Animal Market as shall be indicated by the inspector;
- (b) be attended by the seller or his agent who must provide himself with all head-stalls, picketing ropes and all other necessaries for properly securing the animal at the part or place appropriate for their sale;

(c) be removed from the Animal Market as soon as they are sold. 58M. The following fees shall be paid to the inspector by the person in charge of any animal brought to the Animal Market, that is to say:—

Provided that all young animals running with their dams shall be admitted free of fees into the Animal Market."

8. Bye-law 85 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :---

The fee shall be payable for the period ending the 31st December on every year irrespective of the time when it becomes chargeable." 9. The principal Bye-laws are hereby amended by the insertion of the following Part and bye-laws immediately after bye-law 134.

### "PART XIIA.

## Fees for weighing, measuring and testing goods.

134A. The fees to be paid under the provisions of section 184 of the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to (No. 2) 1945, for the weighing, measuring or testing of goods within the municipal limits shall be the fees set forth in the Schedule of these bye-laws.

134B. The fees to be paid under the provisions of section 189 of the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to (No. 2) 1945, in respect of goods brought within the municipal limits shall be the fees set forth in the Schedule to these bye-laws.

134c.—(1) Whenever any municipal weigher is requested by any person to weigh, measure or test any goods other than any of the goods enumerated in the Schedule hereto, such person shall lay to the municipal weigher, for the use of the municipal corporation, upon such weighing, measuring or testing, a fee at the rate of two paras per oke in respect thereof and such municipal weigher shall give to the person paying the same a printed receipt in respect thereof from a counterfoil book in such form as the Mayor may from time to time prescribe and every person paying any such fee shall require the municipal weigher to whom the same is paid to furnish him with such printed receipt :

Provided that :---

(a) fractions under 10 paras shall not be collected;

(b) for fractions of 10 paras and over and under 20 paras the sum of 20 paras shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing of any goods shall be one piastre.

(2) Nothing in this bye-law contained—

- (a) shall apply or shall be taken to apply to the weighing, measuring or testing of any goods enumerated in the Schedule hereto, or
- (b) shall be taken or construed to give any municipal weigher or to the Municipal Corporation any right to demand the compulsory weighing, measuring or testing of any goods to which this bye-law applies."

10. The principal Bye-laws are hereby amended by the insertion therein of the following Schedule immediately after bye-law 145 :---

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be 1 piastre."
