AIR NAVIGATION ORDER, 1949.

The Minister of Civil Aviation pursuant to Article 64 of the Air Navigation Order, 1949 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") hereby authorizes the Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the said Colony, to exercise in the said Colony the powers of the Minister under the Order which are hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

- (a) As to licences granted under Article 20 of the Order entitling persons to act as members of the operating crew of an aircraft registered in the United Kingdom—
- (i) to renew a licence in accordance with paragraph (3) of that Article;
 - (ii) to take action with respect to a licence in accordance with paragraph (4) (a) (ii) and (iv), paragraph (5) and paragraph (6) of that Article;
- (b) As to licences granted under paragraph (3) of Article 31 of the Order to persons to act in the capacity of aircraft radio maintenance engineers—
- (i) to renew a licence in accordance with sub-paragraph (c) (i) of that paragraph;
 - (ii) to extend in accordance with sub-paragraph (d) of that paragraph the rating included in a licence;
- (c) To issue and renew a validation pursuant to Article 21 of the Order;
- (d) As to licences issued under the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923,—
- To renew pursuant to paragraph (2) (b) of Article 73 of the Order and Section XX of the Air Navigation (General) Regulations, 1949, a pilot's licence to fly public transport or aerial work aircraft and the licence of an aircraft navigator, 1st class or 2nd class, so that such licence may remain in force until a date not later than the 30th day of June, 1950;
- (e) Until the 30th day of June, 1950, to grant to the holder of the licence issued under the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923, entitling him to act in any capacity as a member of the operating crew of an aircraft, a licence under Article 20 of the Order entitling him to act in a corresponding capacity,

upon his being satisfied, having regard to any appropriate requirements contained in the Order or in the said regulations, that any such powers as aforesaid should in a particular case be exercised.
