

No. 213. THE PETROLEUM LAW, 1939.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 9.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 9 of the Petroleum Law, 1939, I, the Acting Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following regulations:—

Suppl. No. 3: 1. These regulations may be cited as the Petroleum (Amendment) Regulations, 1949, and shall be read as one with the Petroleum Regulations, 1940 to 1946 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Petroleum Regulations, 1940 to 1949.

2. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of regulation 109 (as set out in the Petroleum (Amendment) Regulations, 1946) and the substitution therefor of the following regulation:—

"109. When petroleum is imported in bulk, its removal from the ship shall be effected by means of a hose and a metal pipe and it shall be pumped into storage-tanks. Subject to regulation 107 the discharge shall be continuous day and night, until completed, weather and appliances permitting."

No. 214. THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE LAW, 1948.

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 153.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 153 of the Criminal Procedure Law, 1948, I hereby delegate to the Junior Crown Counsel with effect from the 18th May, 1949, all powers vested in me under the said Law, except the power to appeal from any judgment of acquittal by a district court.

2. This delegation shall be in addition to, and not in derogation of, the delegation published under Notification No. 443 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 16th December, 1948.
