## No. 224. THE LAND ACQUISITION LAWS, 1899 TO 1947.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 4.

R. E. TURNBULL,

Whereas it has been represented to me that certain lands within the boundaries of Larnaca Town lying to the north and west of the built-up area, on which the Military Authorities constructed a road to bye-pass the town, are needed, and should be acquired, for use as a permanent public road;

Now, therefore, I, Roland Evelyn Turnbull, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus by virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 2, 3 and 4 of the Land Acquisition Laws, 1899 to 1947, do hereby declare the acquisition of the said lands to be an undertaking of public utility, and do hereby authorize the carrying out of the said undertaking, and do hereby, by virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 of the said Laws, entrust the supervision of the said undertaking to the Director of Public Works.

THE AIR NAVIGATION (COLONIES, PROTECTORATES AND MANDATED TERRITORIES) ORDER, 1927, AS AMENDED BY SUBSEQUENT ORDERS.

It is hereby notified for general information that His Excellency the Acting Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in him by Articles 8A (1) (b) (ii) and 23 of the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) Order, 1927, as amended by subsequent Orders, has been pleased—

- (a) to authorize that, for a period of five months as from the 1st June, 1949, the area of water of the Limassol Port, the limits of which area are set out in the Schedule hereto, shall be used as an aerodrome for the landing and departure of aircraft; and
- (b) to approve the aforesaid aerodrome as a Customs aerodrome.

## SCHEDULE.

The territorial waters of Cyprus contained within a line drawn 135° to the high seas from a point at 34° 41′ 8″ N. of latitude and 33° 4′ 5″ E. of longitude which is situated 3,300 yards North Eastwards of Limassol Fixed Redlight, and a line drawn 135° to the high seas from a point at 34° 39′ 20″ N. of latitude and 33° 0′ 6″ E. of longitude being the centre of Zakaki village, on Admiralty Chart No. 846 of the 3rd February, 1949.
