

THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAWS, 1936 TO 1948.

The following rules made by the Village Health Commission of Panayia, in the District of Paphos, and approved by the Commissioner, are published in the *Gazette*.

RULES MADE BY THE VILLAGE HEALTH COMMISSION OF PANAYIA
UNDER SECTION 9.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 9 of the Public Health (Villages) Laws, 1936 to 1948, the Village Health Commission of Panayia hereby make the following rules:—

1. These rules may be cited as the Village Health (Panayia) (Amendment) Rules, 1949, and shall be read as one with the Village Health (Panayia) Rules, 1938 and 1940 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Rules”), and the principal Rules and these rules may together be cited as the Village Health (Panayia) Rules, 1938 and 1949.

2. The following rules shall be substituted for rules 20, 32, 46, 54 and 57, respectively, of the principal Rules:—

“Rule 20.—The following fees shall be paid by the owner of or the person slaughtering any animal in the slaughter-house, that is to say:—

(a) for every bullock, camel, cow or ox	2	0
(b) for every goat, kid, lamb or sheep under 6 okes ..	4	½
(c) for every goat, kid, lamb or sheep over 6 okes ..	7	
(d) for every swine under 25 okes	6	
(e) for every swine over 25 okes	1	3

Rule 32.—The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any perishable goods in the market of perishable goods, that is to say:—

Per stall or stand, per day:—		s.	p.
(a) Goods worth under 3s.	2	-	2
(b) Goods worth 3s. to 10s.	4	-	4
(c) Goods worth 10s. to 20s.	6	-	6
(d) Goods worth over 20s., 2p. for each additional pound -or part thereof.			

Rule 46.—(1) The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, that is to say:—

	s.	p.
(a) for every carcass of sheep or goat or part thereof ..	7	-
(b) for every carcass of a young lamb or kid or part thereof under 6 okes	4	½
(c) for every carcass of a young lamb or kid or part thereof over 6 okes	7	-
(d) for every carcass of ox, camel, cow or bullock or part thereof	2	0

(2) The fees in paragraph (1) of this rule prescribed shall not be payable by any person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, who is a monthly or yearly lessee of any shop, stall or place in the meat market under rule 45 of these rules.

Rule 54.—(1) The following fees shall be paid by the owner of or the person exposing for sale any carcass of swine or fresh pork in the pork market, that is to say:—

(a) for every carcass of swine or part thereof or portion of fresh pork under 25 okes	6	-
(b) for every carcass of swine or part thereof or portion of fresh pork over 25 okes	1	3

(2) Every such fee shall be paid to the Inspector.

Rule 57.—(1) The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any foodstuffs in the market of foodstuffs, that is to say:—

Per stall or stand, per day:—		s.	p.
(a) Goods worth under 3s.	2	-	2
(b) Goods worth 3s. to 10s.	4	-	4
(c) Goods worth 10s. to 20s.	6	-	6
(d) Goods worth over 20s., 2p. for each additional pound or part thereof.			

(2) Every such fee shall be paid to the Inspector.”
